SCOS January Minutes

January 2015 Minutes President Cindy Adams welcomed members and guest to the first SCOS meeting of the new year.

VP David Janvrin brought the new club projector and talked about the upcoming SCOS Show at Riverbanks Botanical Garden. Stan, Dave, and Cindy will start the SCOS Display and society display area set-ups on Wednesday. Guest societies and vendors will set up their displays on Thursday, 9-5. Members should have all their plants there by 11 AM Thursday for the SC display. Members can bring plant noon-2 on Wednesday if that is better. There was a sign-up sheet passed for anyone willing to clerk at the show. Judging for the show starts at 9 AM Friday and then it is open to the public 1-5 Friday. There was a sign-up list of people to host the club information table during regular show hours to answer orchid questions, give away orchid culture sheets, and promote SCOS membership. Lexington and Richland County residents get free Zoo Friday, admission on SO it is traditionally a busy day at the orchid show. The breakdown for the show is Sunday at 4:45 and members are requested to help with that and cleanup, which goes fast!

The program featured Stan giving orchid show plant tips. These included: Clean off old spikes, do not use butterfly clips to stake an inflorescence, sterilize cutting equipment to prevent spread of disease and virus (recommends flaming them), stake inflorescence to keep under control during transport AND to show flowers to better advantage and put owner name on bottom of pot, provide list of plant names.

For Show and Tell, Walter Procko likened his butterworts to "Little Shop of Horrors". Ailleen Smith had an exceptionally well-bloomed Tolumnia and recommended drying it between watering. She soaks it 10 minutes 2 times a week. Lou Ann Caron brought a lovely Dendrobium "Little Joe". The meeting was closed in due form
