SCOS July 2016 Minutes

President David Janvrin opened the meeting by welcoming guests Kim Dufour and Nancy Boyer.

It was announced that there would be a field trip to Steve Arthur Orchids in Graniteville in September.

David confirmed in response to a question that dues are due in January.

Members should check with Dave Grieve for name tags. He has made new ones.

Four bags of Orchiata were available at the meeting for \$35 each.

Stan announced that the next orchid show the club was invited to participate at is the Triangle Orchid Society Show in November. Set-up will be November 17th and judging on the 18th.

There was a re-cap of the Asheville NC show and thanks to members who donated plants for the display. Special thanks to Stan for planning the display and Dave and Judy Grieve for helping him set it up and take it down.

David introduced our speaker, Mark Reinke, from Marble Branch Farms. Mark started out by announcing he would not have an open house this year and went on to give a dynamite talk on Encyclias. It was chock full of interesting information and photos of selected species and then hybrids that had been made using the species. Here are a few tidbits from the talk:

There are between 144-188 species total (depending on which taxonomist is with most counting) growing as epiphytes and some as lithophytes. Their natural habitats are as far south as the Atlantic drainage in Brazil, north to lower Florida. Mexico and He highlighted the species and hybrids of Encyclias tampensis, plicata, phoenicia, adenocaula, atrorubens, bractescens, dickensoniana, incumbens, alata, parviflora, cordigera, polybulbon, randii, dichroma, and fowliei. Many have good fragrance, such as Encyclia incumbens. Cultural tips include: bright light; good water during growing season (but allow medium to dry between watering); water less frequently in the winter; grow well in baskets or net pots with course, fastdraining medium.

The meeting took a break for lunch and then members were back for Show and Tell.
