February 2022 Minutes

President Mark Mull opened the meeting by welcoming visitors Howard, Cindy, and Stephanie.

At our next meeting on March 19, Stan Hutto will review preparing plants to show, and Clay Owens will go over details, volunteers, and duties for the show.

Our speakers were Susan and Charles Williams. Susan spoke about the genus Galeandra which are small, warm-to-intermediate growing orchids that do well on windowsills. They are characterized by having sepals and petals that are erect over the lip of the blossoms. They prefer dappled light to Cattleya conditions. They should be watered twice per week and fertilized heavily during their growing season, with water and fertilizer withheld after new growths have matured. They may be grown in regular potting mix or a terrestrial mix.

Charles spoke about the genus Calanthe, native to central America, northern South America, Africa, and south and southeast Asia. There are two subgenera: Preptanthe which is deciduous and blooms mid-winter at the base of the leafless pseudobulb, and Eucalanthe, which is evergreen and prefers warm conditions, shade, and consistent moisture year round.

Following our speakers, members displayed their blooming orchids on the Show and Tell table. The raffle was held, following which the meeting was adjourned.


