July 2023 Minutes

President Mark Mull opened the meeting by welcoming many visitors and new members.

There are three upcoming events:

- 1. Triangle Orchid Society Show—JC Ralston Arboretum, Raleigh, September 8-10. We are looking for a volunteer to set up or tear down.
- 2. SCOS Annual Auction will be November 19th. Members are encouraced to provide plants or divisions. The funds raised will go to supporting our 2024 SCOS Show.
- 3. SCOS Orchid Show dates are April 26-28, 2024. Set up on April 24 & 25.

Our speaker was Fred Clarke, owner of Sunset Valley Orchids and hybridizer of outstanding orchids His topic was hybridizing Cattleyas to produce splashed and spotted flowers. He has an article on this subject published in the current AOS Magazine, pages 511—516.

The two important orchids for producing splashed seedlings are C. intermedia v. aquinii, which has splashed petals that look like the lip, and Laelia briegeri, a rupicolous orchid that imparts vigor to its offspring. Considerations when breeding are (1) lavender and yellow are both dominant colors that cancel each other out, producing a white background color in offspring, (2) the orientation of lip (preferably flat versus oriented forward) is the same as the petals, and (3) the lip size determines the petal size. Orchids with narrow lips have equally narrow petals.

When breeding to produce spots, four Cattleya species, all of which bloom in the summer, are important: C. aclandiae, C. leopoldii (especially the coerulea color form), C. schilleriana, and C. loddigesii.

After the program, members discussed the plants they had brought for the show and tell table, and the raffle was held, after which the meeting was adjourned. The next meeting will be Sunday, August 20, at which David Janvrin will present a program on "non-stinky" Bulbophyllums.
