"Beyond the Pot", Bridget Uzar, Carter & Holmes

Bridget will give a hands on class on how you can mount an orchid. You can mount orchids in a variety of ways, on wood, on rocks, in slatted baskets, etc.

Mounted orchids take a little different care, but many types of orchids prefer this method as it more resembles their natural environment. Bridget will provide tips on how to mount and grow and help your plants thrive using this method.

There are several options for the class, and you can make your own mounted orchid.

Bridget will be arriving at 11:30 AM and will have plants for sale. Among these will be bare root mountable Brassolaelia Yellow Bird and Phalaenopsis Meen Estrella for only \$7.50 each. She will accept Cash, Check, or Credit Card.

Bridget will also have mount kits available. These consist of a cedar plank, fishing line, a tag for the plant, and sphagnum moss. @ \$3.50 each
